



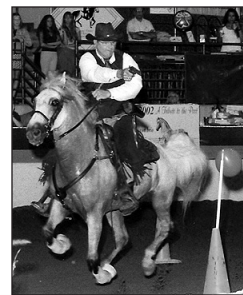

Rick Meyer was introduced to Cowboy Mounted Shooting in 1999 by multiple World and National Champion Annie Bianco Ellett. He had been working professionally with horses since the early 1970's.

Rick co-founded and is past president of St. Louis Cowboy Mounted Shooting and the Illinois Renegades. He and his wife, Janice, own Royal Oak Ranch in Troy, Illinois and compete throughout the United States.

Some of his more prestigious wins include: National "Colt Eliminator" Top Ten Cowboy, MO State Mens 3 Winner, IL State Mens 3 Winner, World Mens 3 4th Place, Mid-Eastern Senior Mens 4 Winner and Rifle Competition 3rd Place

Cowboy Mounted Shooting events are open to all horses and mules, welcome men and women riders, and offer competition levels from novice to professional.

This Clinic is designed for

beginning Cowboy Mounted Shooters and will cover:

- How to get started
- Horse suitability
- Selecting the right guns and holsters
- Required tack and dress
- Making horse and rider a "Team"
- Course management

Rick's training background includes Thoroughbreds, Quarter Horses, Tennessee Walkers, Fox Trotters, Morgans, Polo Ponies, Appaloosas and Paso Finos.

He started breeding and training Paso Finos in 1978 and has won more than 100 National and Grand National Championships. Not only does he travel across the country giving clinics (you may have seen them on RFD-TV), but he co-authored the first "step by

step" training book for Paso Finos, "Horse Sense in Training" now in its 5th printing.

Clinic Fee - \$150

Clinic fee covers two-hour sessions on Saturday and Sunday. It includes one stall with first bedding, shared use of a tack stall, one exhibitor badge for rider and one weekend pass to Horse Fair. (Evening show requires separate ticket.) Clinic horses will stall together.

Clinic sessions may be audited by Horse Fair pass holders (general admission: \$12 per day; \$20 weekend).

In addition to clinics in the arena, Meyer will host one-hour Question & Answer sessions each day for clinic riders and observers.

All horses must have a current negative Coggins. Out-of-state horses must have Health Certificate and Entry Permit number. Signed release forms are required from all participants.

Illinois Horse Fair, presented by Purina Mills, Midway Trailer Sales and John Deere, is in its 21st year and annually attracts more than 10,000 horse people.
